To see the excitement (and the dirt) on their faces and the results of the adrenaline rush that some of these people haven't felt since they suffered a life-altering injury, solidified the decision we made to donate. Seeing a video of another athlete who was able to rip around in the high country above Crested Butte with his 14-year-old son, who was 6 months old at the time of his father's injury, seriously brought tears to my eyes, and I was never more proud to be part of this mission with Tim and the Return to Dirt Family.




